- What its like to be involved and how it makes you feel

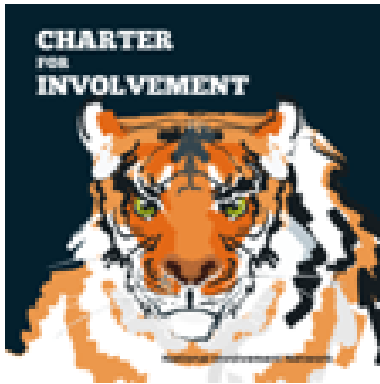
Conclusion
